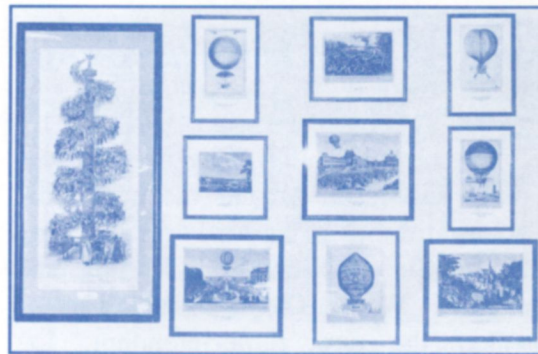
## EL POMAR GRANT

In the March 1990 Newsletter, The Friends reported receiving a \$25,000 grant from El Pomar Foundation. By January 1992 all of those funds were expended in support of the Gimbel Conservation and Preservation Project.

Some of the major goals accomplished with El Pomar contribution included:

- Installing security labels in over 5,000 books.
- Producing color microfilm and microfiche copies of the most valuable 1000 antique prints in the Collection to protect the originals from damage caused by the wear and tear of handling by users.
- Encapsulating 3,165 delicate items in special acid-free Mylar covers for proper storage.
- Constructing a special case to store historical aviation medallions.
- Purchasing over 100 custom built, acid-free Solander boxes to store rare books.

The grants from El Pomar and Boettcher Foundations, combined with generous donations from members, will enable The Friends to complete the conservation and preservation project in the near future.



## NEW LOOK FOR GIMBEL ROOM

The Boettcher Foundation Grant provided the funds to mount 1,019 aeronautical prints. For display on the walls of the Gimbel Room, 28 of the most significant historical prints were framed. Titles and dates were placed on inserts in each print. Consequently, visitors to the Gimbel Room can now follow the chronological evolution of ballooning as well as other historical events. We now plan to publish a brochure so that visitors will have a record of what they have observed.



## BOETTCHER FOUNDATION GRANT

In the November 1990 Newsletter, The Friends reported receipt of \$23,000 from the Boettcher Foundation to defray expenses involved in preserving the prints in the Gimbel Aeronautical Collection in the Air Force Academy Library. The entire amount has been expended on the project.

The Friends contracted with Novis Frame and Art Gallery of Colorado Springs to provide legends, frames and mats for 28 specially selected prints to be displayed in the Gimbel Room at the Academy Library.

A total of 1,019 aeronautical prints have been processed with Boettcher funds.

## GENERAL "HAP" ARNOLD TAPES

The Friends joined forces with the Falcon Foundation in an extensive project to preserve the quality of the 207 oral history tapes developed by Air Force Historian, Dr. Murray Green, for his research of the career of General H. H. Arnold. Dr. Green interviewed scores of military and civilian leaders who had known and worked with General Arnold. The original tapes were recorded almost 30 years ago and the condition of the original tapes was poor. With the use of the latest sound technology, the quality of the sound has been preserved. In addition to the production of archival quality tape recordings, the interviews have been reproduced onto individual cassettes. Cadets and other researchers can now listen to the voices of these pioneer airpower leaders. This collection of tapes is among the best primary source of American aeronautical materials in existence.
