Cadets Seek Ex-POW Bracelets and Plan Memorial at USAFA

For years millions of Americans have been wearing bracelets to honor and to call public attention to the prisoners of war and missing in action. The Cadet Heritage Committee is sponsoring a project that involves the use of the bracelets. The cadets want to ensure that the bracelets are not just thrown away after the return of all the prisoners. Additionally, they would like to establish a permanent display at the Academy honoring the men. The cadets are asking all Americans to send the bracelets to the committee after all prisoners have returned and the missing accounted for.

The Heritage Committee is working in conjunction with Voices in Vital America (VIVA) and the National League of Families. "All three organizations ask that all those who have kept the vigil alive for so many years not send letters or bracelets to the returning POW/MIA's families," said C2C Lance W. Bachran, Chairman of the Heritage Committee. "Let the Committee send one bracelet and one letter listing all those who wore each man's name. We plan to do this when the returnees are settled." The other bracelets sent to the cadets will be used in the planned display at the Academy.

The Academy will soon be a distribution point for buttons, bumper stickers, stars, and other materials welcoming the returning prisoners. People wishing these items should send a self-addressed, stamped envelope to the below address. After all prisoners return and the missing have been accounted for, Americans can send

their bracelets to the same address. The wearer should tape his name to the bracelet.

POW's Write Poetry

Many of the ex-prisoners wrote poetry during their years of captivity. It told of their hopes and their experiences. It also told of their sorrows.

Lt. Col. James Quincy Collins, Jr., composed a poem on the learning of his father's death. It read:

No one will ever know the
Pain of sorrow and despair,
That ripped my heart and tore
My soul and left me standing there . . .

Now that the darkened veil
Has covered one so dear to me,
So many of my hopes and
Dreams I'll never, ever see.

Capt. Tom Browning, '64, a POW for nearly seven years wrote a poem to his wife, Ann.

"The brilliance of sunlight in adolescent morn
More radiant than crystal
It seems to say
There will be warmth and calm today . . .
Love's flame burns brighter than ever before
I pledge you my love
Evermore."



CAPT. JERRIS BOLT

Capt. Bolt has three children, Lisa and two others, NV 89109; and William T. Bolt.

A memorial to his memory. Donated to the Bolt Memorial at AFB, NV 89109.

While a cadet, he was the commandant's list of the Skating Director, also a member of the Dodo Staff, and a lowing graduate. Subsequent assignments at Bentwater RCAF at Cam Ranh Bay as an officer with the 1st AFB from 1964 to 1968. Missions in Southeast Asia included the Dodo with 14 Oak Leaf Clusters.

In 1971 he was a Demonstration Pilot and took over the
